Portraits: Semana Santa Technical Information

All images are:

- silver gelatin prints, toned and hand printed by the photographer to meet archival standards.
- signed in pencil on the verso,
- limited to editions of 25,
- matted and over-matted in white, acid free board, and
- framed in standard mat-black, museum frames.

The majority of prints are printed on 16 x 20 inch paper & framed 20 x 24 inches with some images printed 11 x 14 inch size framed to 16 x 20 inches. Artistically I chose to print the 11 x 14 inch images to allow for more intimate viewing.

Installations

Depending upon available space, the proposed exhibition in its entirety consists of forty-four photographs. For smaller installations and multiple artist shows, this body of work may be divided into subsets without adversely affecting the integrity of the work or intention of the artist. In addition, some photographs are diptychs designed to be hung salon style.

- 40 to 44 prints require 141 to 150 linear feet
- 22 to 24 prints require 90 to 100 linear feet
- 8 to 12 prints require 15 to 24 linear feet

Video Installation

- There is a "video phrase" describing the dance as it occurs throughout the night. It is intended to be hung with the photographs in a digital picture frame. It is available for viewing on my web site.
- The second, longer video is intended to be shown on a TV screen not larger than 30 inches. This video shot during daylight describes the 'Stations of the Cross' procession as well as dancing in the Mission courtyard.

Artist's Talk

A DVD of the Artist's Talk is provided for inclusion in the exhibition.

In addition, I am prepared to speak to the public on my experiences with the Tarahumara while photographing and traveling in the *Sierras*. In fact, when possible, I am requesting an announced time and place to speak on the Tarahumara.
